Official Rules

1. Eligibility

- a) all person 18 years of age or older are eligible to enter the tournament. Anglers under 18 must fish with a parent or guardian

2. Requirements

- a) each contestant must have in his or her possession a valid Saskatchewan fishing license
 - b) promoters and organizations assisting in tournament operation, their agencies and agents, are not responsible for death, injury, damage liability, theft, fire or any loss to any entrants
 - c) Each entrant upon signing an accepted entry form will in effect be signing a waiver form. Each entrant will be required to have Canadian or US coast guard approved personal floatation device (PFD).
 - d) each entrant is urged to wear a PFD.
- All contestants are required to observe Canadian rules and regulations concerning safe boating.

3. Fishing.

- a) only WALLEYE will be included in official totals.
- b) only those fish caught on hook and line in the usual manner will be accepted.
- c) each Fisherman will be allowed one (1) line in the water at a time. Spare rods and equipment may be carried in the boat.
- d) Live bait and artificial bait and lures are allowed. Electronic or electric luring or attracting devices are prohibited, No live minnows.
- e) Entrants will conduct themselves as true sportsmen and gentlemen when fishing near another boat. There is no restricted area around another boat, however no boat may touch another boat. No interference with another angler's line will be allowed.
- f) a contestant must not leave the boat to land a fish or untangle lines or lures
- g) **Only two (2) walleye can be over 21.5"**
- h) Fish will be measured with a pinched tail.
- i) the tournament daily limit shall be six fish per team
- j) All fish will be released alive after weigh in. Any fish not able to be live released will be assessed a 1.0lb penalty. All dead fish will be donated to charity.
- k) Stringers and ropes MAY NOT be used to confine fish caught.
- l) Anyone caught releasing a dead fish will be disqualified.

4. Boats and Equipment

- a) All boats will be required to meet Canadian regulations.
- b) All boats will be required to carry a provincial or state registration in accordance with the regulations of the home province or state of the contestant owning the boat.
- c) Boats may be equipped with electronic positioning or trolling motors.
- d) electronic and electrical depth finders, thermometers, oxygen meters, etc. are allowed.
- e) **No anchoring will be allowed**

5. Tournament Boundaries

- a) The entire length of Boundary Dam including portion of the river up to

Long Creek Bridge, excluding 180 perimeter area around the hot water return.

6. Weigh in

- a) The scale for weigh in will be open throughout the fishing day.
 - b) Each team will be responsible for their own catch. Under no circumstances may anyone other than the contestants handle or touch a fish until after it was been presented for weigh in.
- A team member will accompany the fish to the scales. Each team will receive a copy of their scale ticket each time they weight in a fish. The scale tickets are to be initialled by one the team members.

7. Required Activities

- a) All contestants are required to attend the pre-tournament meeting at the EWF Clubhouse at 7:00 PM on May 9th, 2025. One (1) team member must be present.
- b) any contestant involved in a protest must be on call for three (3) hours following the end of the fishing day.
- c) All contestants are required to co-operate with members of the press for interviews and photographs.

8. Fishing Hours and Starting

- a) The fishing day will start at 7:00AM and end at 3:30PM on Saturday, May 10, 2025
 - b) Contestants who return late will be penalized five (5) percent of their total weight for each minute late and will be disqualified from any large fish prize.
 - c) The Boundary Dam Rec. Area will serve as tournament headquarters and contestants will be required to start and end the day at this point. Boats will leave in two flights. Boats will leave at drop of flag by patrol boat anchored in mid-lake
- **Boats are flighted upon receipt of paid registration**

9. Boat Identification and Patrolling

- a) All contestant boats will be identified with a team number which will be assigned upon receipt of registration
- b) If an emergency occurs, patrol boats will be available for aid. Patrol boat personnel will be clearly marked for easy identification. **ALL BOATS WILL BE ALLOWED TO LAND AT HEADQUARTERS ONLY.**
- c) Boats maybe inspected before, and during the tournament. Tournament officials will be checking boats at the launch area and patrol boats will be intensively patrolling the fishing areas. Any cheating will result in immediate disqualification.

10. Prizes

- a) prizes will be awarded at the end of the day, but are subject to final checks by the committee.
- b) If there are less than 35 teams entered, the committee reserves the right to alter prizes accordingly

11. Contingency Prizes

- a) Contingency prizes may be awarded by contributors, supporters, or other interested parties.
- b) Rules for contingency prizes may be stipulated by those offering the prize

12. Spirit of the rule

- a) All rules have loopholes. It is the intention of the sponsor to provide an honest, sportsmen-like tournament. In the interest of good sportsmanship, contestants are reminded that 'the spirit of the rule' will prevail in all judgement cases.

13. Protests

- a) Any contestant has the right to make a protest against another contestant. A protest form is available from the tournament chairman and should be filled out and presented to the chairman within one hour of the close of the fishing day.
- b) A special protest committee will convene for the purpose of determining action. Both parties and possible witnesses may be called before the committee. The committee will meet within three (3) hours of any protest being formally presented.
- c) a \$150.00 protest fee will be required to accompany any formal protest. The fee is to be returned if the protest is found to be valid by the protest committee. If invalid, the fee will not be returned.
- d) The decision of the protest committee is final in all cases.

14. Miscellaneous

- a) All questions or problems relating to the rules of this tournament are to be referred to the tournament committee. Their decision will be final in all cases. No other person can be considered a spokesman for the rules of the tournament.
- b) If one of the two team members drop out before the tournament, he may be replaced by the choice of the remaining team member. The chairman must be notified of the change before the tournament.
- c) If an entire team drops out before the tournament, the place will be filled by the tournament chairman and not be the choice of the team that drops out. The entry fee will be refunded only if notice is given at least 14 days prior to the start of the tournament.
